Lesson Plan

Grade Level: Kindergarten Lesson Plan #7: "Mindful Monkeys" - How to be a Helper

Notes

Students should focus on finding text evidence for their answers in this lesson. They can also color the graphic organizer once they complete it.

Learning Target

- <u>I can</u> describe why a character makes certain choices in a story and what the result is.
- <u>I'll show this by</u> explaining how I can make choices in real life to help others.

Materials Needed

- Copy of "Caps for Sale and the Mindful Monkeys"
- Graphic organizer

Do Now

The class reviews the storyline of "Caps for Sale and the Mindful Monkeys." Time permitting, the teacher should read the story again.

Activity 1

The teacher starts by asking students what makes these monkeys different from other monkeys. Answers can range from literal to abstract.

• What can these monkeys do that makes them special?

The teacher then asks the students what the monkeys did to help Pezzo. What happened to Pezzo?

- Why did he need help?
- What did the monkeys do to make things better for him?
- Why was it so important for Pezzo to have caps waiting for him when he got home?

Lastly, the teacher asks the students how the monkeys knew Pezzo needed their help.

- What did the monkeys notice about Pezzo?
- How did the monkeys know he needed help?
- How did the monkeys know what to do?

Activity 2

Now that the monkeys' actions and choices have been discussed, students can turn the discussion to their classroom community. Each student should write down one thing they can do to help a friend in need.
